Wei-An started dancing because he thought it was cool. When he saw people in music videos grooving, spinning (often on their heads), flipping, and flying through the air, he wanted to be like them. This eventually led him to study in the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts, work in Frontier Danceland, and into being an independent artist. During this time, he has had the opportunity to work with choreographers like Pichet Klunchun, Wu Chien-Wei, Noa Zuk, Ole Khamchanla, Christina Chan, Lee Mun Wai, Gabrielle Nankivell, Luke Smiles and Sita Ostheimer. He still likes to spin on his head, and continues to delve into the worlds of hip-hop, b-boying, and tricking, disciplines that feed into his study of The Art of Falling as well as the wider body of his contemporary dance practice.



1. Kaleidoscope (excerpts)

Choreographed by Kim-Sanh Châu (Canada / France / Vietnam) Performed by Nhung Vo (Vietnam) Composers: Chittakone Baccam & Michel F. Côté

Leaning between dance and installation, Kaleidoscope is a sensorial journey where bodies unravel subconscious and fleeting dreams. Floating through concise positions and with gentle corporeity, the dancer opens our oneiric imaginations. Wearing kaleidoscopic glasses, the audience slides into a surreal synesthetic realm of colors, music and emotions.

Kim-Sanh Châu is a French-Vietnamese dance artist based in Montréal. Her practice includes choreography, interpretation and curation. Trained in dance at UQAM, she also holds a master degree in finance. Her choreographic research evolves around the conception of structures, exploring the corporeity which lies in their interstices. Her work was presented at Quartiers Danses, MAI – Montréal, Arts Interculturels, Accès Asie, RAW Art Space (Malaysia) and Europe Meets Asia in Contemporary Dance, programmed by the Goethe Institute (Vietnam). *Kaleidoscope* will be presented at Tangente and Krossing-Over (Vietnam) in 2018. Châu is also very involved in screendance creation. In 2017, she was awarded Best Direction 2017 by Festival Quartiers Danses for *Inner Smoke*. Châu also curates a yearly screendance event at Studio 303.

Nhung Vo lives in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam. She started dance training in 1999 at the Vietnamese Dance School. She won Best Female Dancer at the Vietnam Dance Festival, and 4th place in the TV Show So You Think You Can Dance Vietnam. A devoted, independent artist who trains in her own style on a daily basis. she has worked with choreographers Linh Rateau (Vietnam), Sébastien Ly (France), and Kim-Sanh Châu (Canada). In September 2017 she presented her show *Feel Yourself* at the Dancenter in Ho Chi Minh City. She is currently studying Modern Jazz with ISTD.

Inspired by our nation's society wherein we are constantly struggling to balance between what is deemed 'right' and 'wrong'. How long will it last? And how will it end?

The choreography has been constructed with images, shapes, and designs as the primary tools of exploration.

Fauzi was born in Jelebu, Negeri Sembilan, and holds a Diploma and a Bachelor of Dance (Choreography) Hons. from ASWARA. Fauzi is currently a principal dancer at ASK Dance Company (ADC). He won 3 gold medals at the World Championship of Performing Arts (WCOPA) at Los Angeles in 2011. Recently shooting to fame as a finalist of Miss Universe Malaysia, Maria Devonne was born in 1993 in Kota Kinabalu. She picked up her dancing shoes at 16 years old as a hip hop dancer and pursued her dreams at ASWARA, completing a diploma and degree majoring in choreography. A member of ASK Dance Company from 2014 to 2017, she won the Gold Medal at Andong Mask Festival 2014 in South Korea and was nominated as Best Featured Dancer in the BOH Cameronian Awards for her performance in Mohd Yunus Ismail's "when they ate the apple". Aside from participating in *Jamu, Gelombang Baru, Tapestry, Short+Sweet, Main Zapin* and *Tari*, she has danced with choreographers such as Naim

Syahrazad, Fauzi Amirudin, Joseph Gonzales, and Gerard Mosterd. She recently danced the duet "between ears not legs" created with Mohd Shafiq, in *Release 6.0* in Singapore.
