

TAI CHUN WAI dived into the arts through playing the 24 Festive Drums. Currently a full-time performer with Orang Orang Drum Theatre, he is a djembe player as well as a street drummer under his stage name WaaiwaiiDrum. He also engages in arts education.

Chun Wai is fascinated by how to perform with the 'body', as the focus of learning, creation and performance are all centralised on the element of the 'body'. Keen to explore further on physical movement, he has learnt tai chi, capoeira, butoh, yoga, contemporary dance, and the list goes on. Since the MCO two years ago, his focus has shifted to dance improvisation.

2. Sat

Sat is a work-in-progress. The choreographer explores the dancers' movements using several tasks such as playing with the meaning of words, interpreting movements with several types of emotions, and playing with rhythm and tempo.

MURNI OMAR did her diploma and degree in dance at Akademi Seni Budaya dan Warisan Kebangsaan (ASWARA) and her M.A in Contemporary Dance Performance at the University of Limerick, Ireland. She has performed as the main character in traditional theatre such as Mek Mulong dan randai. She was a full-time dancer in ASWARA Dance

Company (2011-2013). In Ireland, she was chosen to participate in the Step Up program under Fabulous Beast Dance Theater. In 2016, she was also part of the collaborative team which presented the dance and theatre work *Langkan*. She was also chosen to be part of *Where Two Seas Meet*, a cross-cultural collaboration with Katja Grässli from the Netherlands.

Murni has created several contemporary dances works such as 'Salam', 'Obligation', 'Jomheboh', 'Semengat', 'Lost', 'It', 'Igai', 'Pasuk', and 'Rasa'. Murni acknowledges the support of the Faculty of Dance ASWARA in this dance production.

3. Antharatma

Shiva is the absolute reality, or absolute consciousness that makes up our cosmos. He is the transcendent aspect of cosmic consciousness, or the source of everything and all that is, while Shakti is exquisitely beautiful with a flowing and shape-shifting quality to her embracing reality as a dance. She is fluid, flowing and powerfully flexible.

Shakti's energy can be seen in everything that lives as the manifest, while Shiva's energy is formless.

Shiva is the soul while Parvati is the body. He is the very energy on which the entire creation rests. This energy pervades the entire universe and is present within every living being. Shakti is the nature. She creates life within herself. She is the bearer of the potential creative seed.

Shakti (energy) when united with Shiva (cosmic consciousness) is called Parabhrahman, the absolute. Energy can be nurtured and guided by consciousness but consciousness itself can't express itself without energy.

Together, they represent the manifest and unmanifest.

GURUVAYUR USHA DORAI is founder and principal of Laasya Arts Academy, a renowned Indian classical dance and music school in Malaysia. As the only daughter of veteran mridangam maestro Guruvayur Dorai, she is blessed to have a strong heritage of culture, tradition and knowledge of the performing arts. Her training in traditional Carnatic music began under Guruvayur Ponnamal, and was furthered by Maestro Neyveli Santhana Gopalan. She has had the honor of being mentored by such musicians like Srimathi Suguna Varadhachari, Sri Rajendran Narayanan Achari and Sri Suresh Ramachandran.

In nattuvangam, the titlating vibrations that accompany dance, she was trained by Shrimathi Indra Rajan and guided by Shri Pandanallur Srinivasa Pillai. In dance, she has been awarded a Diploma in Bharatanatyam by Vadhini Natyalaya, a school of Bharatanatyam headed by Mahaguru Shrimathi Indra Rajan, and took up dance as a career and was conferred the title of Madura Natya Mamani. She has also earned a BA Degree from Madras University in Sociology with music as an ancillary subject.

With her own institution established in 2003, her vision for Laasya Arts Academy has and always will be to create awareness in the dance and music of South India by promoting and exposing students to the many faces of the ancient fine arts.

Born and raised in Seremban, Negeri Sembilan, CHRISTINE CHEW started dance at the age of 13 in Chinese classical dance and ballet. A graduate from ASWARA, with a Diploma in Dance 2008-2011 and Bachelor of Dance 2011-2014 with a major in choreography, Christine also completed her Bharatanatyam arangetram, a solo debut in the classical Indian dance form, in 2014.

In 2013, Christine joined full length classical Indian dance drama *Panchali Sabatham*, choreographed by Sri Shankar Kandasamy, and also performed in *Crossing Borders* in 2017, a Bharatanatyam production with ASK Dance Company. Recently she received a Create Now grant from CENDANA to produce and perform alongside Kimberly Yap and Mamad Samsudin, in dance film *Trip To Adda* which aired in July 2022. She recently founded a project-based company called Nine Performing Arts Company, based in Seremban.

This choreography is the result of exploration from research that has been carried out on the methods of creating traditional elements in contemporary choreography. In the field of writing, a corpus is a collection of written texts or a body of writing on a particular subject. In this case, the choreography is a work-in-progress where a collection of ideas and methods was used to create a contemporary work with traditional elements. The dancers not only play a role as dancers but as material in the study and creative process of choreography.

FAILLUL ADAM did a diploma and degree in dance under the Faculty of Dance ASWARA and pursued his M.A. at the University of Limerick, Ireland. In 2014, he was selected for the Step up Dance Project in Ireland with Fabulous Beast Dance Theatre. He received a BOH Cameronian Arts Award in 2015 in a mixed-bill category for collaboration 'Nasi Ekonomi' with Suhaili Micheline. In 2016, he also performed a full-length work Langkan with Shahrul Mizad, Iefiz Alaudin, Murni Omar, and Fasyali Fadzly. In 2018, he worked with Kee Thuan Chye as a choreographer in the theatre production Swordfish+Concubine. In 2020, he presented a mixed-bill showcase of his own choreography under The Faculty of Dance ASWARA entitled In Transit: An Evening of Contemporary Dance Performance.

Her first contemporary dance piece 'Don't you like you?' earned the Champion in the Junior Category of "Malaysia, Let's Dance!" Malaysian International Dance Organization's (MIDO) Dance Championship 2019. Her second contemporary dance piece 'The Bond', earned the Festival Director's Award at Short+Sweet Malaysia 2019 Junior Dance (KL). In the same year, she restaged 'Don't you like you?' and earned 4th place (CK) in Star of Canaan Dance International Ballet Competition Malaysia. Her newest contemporary dance piece 'Grab the Shadow of Yourself' first appeared in Short+Sweet Malaysia 2022 Dance (KL).

traditional dance works as well as choreographic possibilities based on tradition, inspired by Chinese culture, social phenomena and environmental protection. His works include 'Bamboo', 'Bamboo Song', 'High Mountain and Flowing Water', 'Feng Wan Yu' and 'Painting Lotus'. He is currently a freelance dancer, choreographer and director of Chinese dance.

HAN FONG DANCE ENSEMBLE aims to promote Chinese dance in Malaysia. Encompassing traditional, classical and contemporary Chinese dances, it also provides opportunities for dancers to perform.
